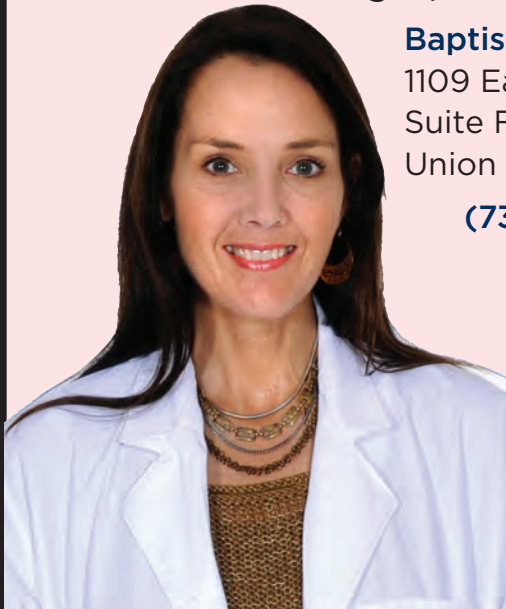

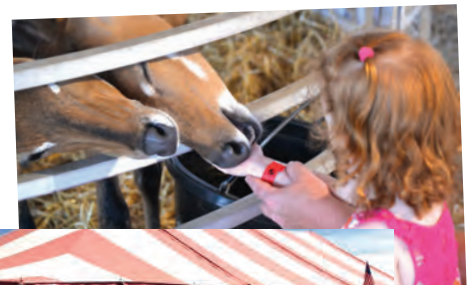

General Rules and Regulations

1. The Fairgrounds and buildings will be opened to the general public each day at 10 a.m.
2. Admission to the Fairgrounds Monday – Thursday \$12.00, Friday & Saturday \$15.00 for all ages except babies in arms, which includes gate admission, events, & rides. All visitors will be required to pay this price whether they plan to ride or not.
3. Reasonable precautions will be taken to protect all exhibits, however; competitive, commercial, and all other items will be exhibited or displayed at owner’s risk.
4. Exhibitors must be residents of Obion County, a member of an Obion County FCE Club, a member of an Obion County Quilters Guild, a member of the NWTN Master Gardeners, or attend an Obion County School unless otherwise designated in the various departments.
5. All articles must have been made since the 2015 Fair, unless otherwise stated in each Department.
6. All articles must be listed in the actual owner’s name and by number.
7. Only items listed in the premium list will be accepted.
8. No person may exhibit more than one item in any one lot.
9. Placing will be designated by ribbon: First - Blue; Second - Red; Third - White. Premiums will be paid as soon as practical after the judging has been completed. In case of an error, premiums are paid by official judging sheets not ribbon placed on actual items.
10. In cases where there is only one entry in a lot, the Judge may award either first, second, or third place, in accordance with the merit of the article exhibited.
11. The Judges shall be instructed not to award premiums to entries not worthy of merit, or articles borrowed or purchased for competition, or to those INCORRECTLY ENTERED.
12. Any exhibitor who publicly expresses disapproval of the Judges’ decision or who is guilty of conduct unbecoming an exhibitor, his/her premiums will be forfeited, and he/she may be excluded from the grounds. Also any exhibitor who enters an article and refuses to show it without good cause, may be subject to the same treatment.
13. **All premium checks will be forfeited if not cashed by September 15th of the current year.**
14. Directors, their husbands or wives, and children living at home are not eligible for the nightly drawing. This does not include adult children who do not reside at the same address.
15. Exhibitors must confine all activities within the limits of their allocated space. Salespeople, demonstrators, or others are not permitted to extend their activities into the aisles or outside their assigned area.
16. The distribution or posting of handbills, posters, etc., throughout the Fairgrounds and buildings is prohibited. Exhibitors may advertise and distribute from within their designated space only.
17. Permission for the use of sound producing apparatus must be obtained from the Obion County Fair Association Directors. The apparatus must be of such a nature as not to cause annoyance or inconvenience to other exhibitors, concessionaires, or visitors.
18. The Fair Association reserves the right to refund, in whole or in part, money paid for privileges or concessions and refuse to allow any party to operate or do business should they become objectionable. The management of the Fair and a censorship committee shall have the privilege of inspecting any concession or privilege stand; those failing to comply with the laws of Tennessee or the rule of the Fair Association shall be compelled to remove the concession or stand from the Fairgrounds.
19. No merchandise shall be given away without the approval of the Fair Board.
20. Drawings for gifts or premiums conducted by the exhibitors must be made prior to the close of the Fair and name and address of the winners delivered to the Fair Office. In no case may the exhibitors use the name of the Obion County Fair Association in any “You May Have Won Absolutely Free” type of mail-out or telephone promotion. Exhibitors guilty of this behavior will be barred from returning to the Fairgrounds.
21. Solicitation of donations by exhibitors from their booths, or by any other person or organization is prohibited.
22. The Board of Directors reserve the right to amend and add to these rules as they, in their judgment, may deem advisable. In the event of conflict of general and special rules, the special rules will govern.
23. The Obion County Fair Association reserves the right to declare off, any events, classes or premiums because of acts of God, such as excessive rains, or causes not within the power of management to control.
24. Obion County Fair Association does not discriminate against race, color, national origin, sex, or handicap.

1. Exhibitor must be a resident of Obion County or a member of a FCE Club or the NWTN Master Gardeners.
2. Entry Date & Time:
Saturday, August 18, 2018, 9 a.m. until 1 p.m.
3. All entries are taken in the Domestic Arts Building.
4. No commercially grown flowers or commercial arrangements of any kind will be permitted in competition. All exhibitors must arrange their own entries.
5. No exhibitor may have more than one entry in any one lot.
6. All specimens must be grown by the exhibitor.
7. All potted plants must have been in the possession of the exhibitor and in pots for at least three months. Containers for single specimens will be furnished. All containers and accessories will be entered at the owner's risk.
9. Exhibitors may use accessories ONLY in specified lots.
10. AFTER A POTTED PLANT HAS WON FIRST PLACE IT MAY NOT BE ENTERED AGAIN FOR TWO YEARS.
11. ITEMS NOT LISTED IN THE CATALOG WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
12. Entries will not be released until 9 a.m. on the Monday following the close of the Fair.

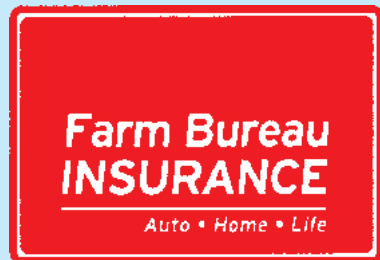

SUMMARY: LIVESTOCK HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR FAIRS AND EXHIBITIONS

GENERAL:

- A. All stalls, pens, chutes, etc. located on the grounds of fairs and exhibitions shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected with a disinfectant approved by USDA, APHIS between each scheduled fair or exhibition.
- B. All livestock (except poultry and equine) which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent identification. Certificates for this purpose shall be valid for ninety (90) days from date of issue. (Tennessee livestock only, out-of-state certificates are valid for thirty (30) days from the date of issue)
- C. No animal showing clinical signs of infectious or communicable disease shall be allowed to enter or remain on premises of fairs or exhibitions. It shall be the responsibility of the manager of each event to assure prompt removal of such animals.

LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING WITHIN THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

[Certificates of Veterinary Inspection Valid for a Period of Ninety (90) Days]

- A. SWINE: All swine which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent identification or sufficient description to identify each animal.
- B. CATTLE: All cattle which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent, official identification.
- C. POULTRY: (1) Sponsors of poultry shows or exhibitions shall notify the Tennessee Department of Agriculture at least **thirty (30) days prior to show or exhibition**. (2) Poultry found not to be in apparent good health shall be removed immediately from any show or exhibition.
- D. HORSES & OTHER EQUIDAE: Horses and other Equidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test within the preceding twelve (12) months.
- E. SHEEP: (1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (2) All sheep that move within the state, with the exception of wethers under the age of 18 months that are produced for slaughter only, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- F. GOATS: (1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- G. CAMELIDS: Camelids must have an official veterinary health certificate as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01 (1).
- H. CAPTIVE CERVIDAE: Captive Cervidae must have an official veterinary health certificate as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01 (1).

LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING OUTSIDE THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

Livestock and Poultry entering fairs and exhibitions from areas outside the State of Tennessee shall be subject to current Tennessee import requirements. Please contact the state veterinarian's office regarding questions or recent changes to these rules.

These interstate requirements are summarized as follows:

- A. ALL SPECIES (except poultry): Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection valid for thirty (30) days and individual permanent official identification, except for equine. Equine must have sufficient description to identify the animal.
 - B. CATTLE: Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows: (1) Tuberculosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of tuberculosis. (2) Brucellosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of brucellosis. Test eligible cattle – Intact male or female cattle eighteen (18) months or older. (Vaccinates and non-vaccinates)
 - C. SWINE: No testing requirements for swine unless originating from a region not considered free of Brucellosis and Pseudorabies.
 - D. HORSES AND OTHER EQUINES: Animals six (6) months of age or older - negative equine infectious anemia (Swamp Fever) test within twelve (12) months.
 - E. POULTRY: Originate directly from a Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock and an H5/H7 Avian Influenza Clean Flock, or be accompanied by evidence of a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within ninety (90) days and a negative Avian Influenza test within twenty-one (21) days.
 - F. SHEEP: (1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (2) All sheep that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
 - G. GOATS: (1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
 - H. CAMELIDAE: Same requirements as for cattle.
 - I. CERVIDAE: Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows: (1) Brucellosis: Same requirements as for cattle. (2) Tuberculosis: (a) All cervidae shall originate in herds which have had a negative herd test for tuberculosis within twelve (12) months with a USDA approved single cervical test and individual imported animals shall be negative to the single cervical test within thirty (30) days of entry; or (b) Animals not originating in tested herds as described above must test negative to two (2) single cervical tests at least ninety (90) days apart, the second test conducted not more than thirty (30) days prior to entry.
- NOTE:** *(Contact an accredited veterinarian for further details of import rules).* Fair association or exhibition or management shall inform exhibitors of the rules of this chapter, and shall notify the State Veterinarian or his agent of any violations. Exhibitors shall present evidence of compliance with this chapter to the State Veterinarian or his agent upon request. These rules constitute a minimum legal standard and in no way restrict the right of fair and exhibition managers to establish additional or more stringent requirements. 2/18/16

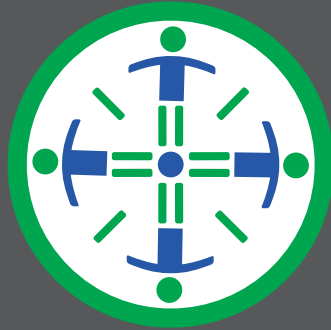

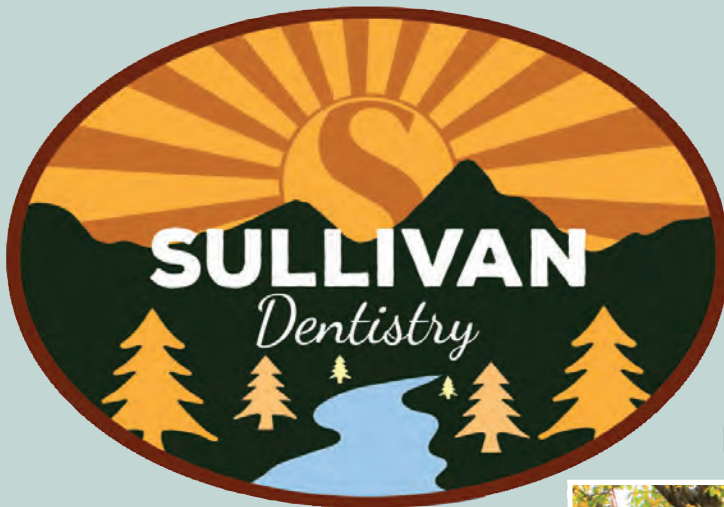

4. All sheep in purebred classes must be registered in flock books of their respective breed associations and owned for at least 60 days prior to show. **Purebred classes must have 10 entries by 2 different exhibitors to have their own breed class. All papers will be checked before the show.**
5. All animals must be entered and exhibited under the name appearing on the registration paper.
6. Ewes shown in market classes are not eligible for breeding classes.
7. For the registered show, an exhibitor is allowed 2 animals per lot.
8. Animals must be shown by owner except in classes where owner has more than one animal, then \ the other animal must be shown by a Junior exhibitor.
9. In the Commercial Ewe Show, the exhibitor may show a maximum of 2 yearlings and 3 lambs.
10. Ewes shown in commercial class are not eligible for either the breeding or market lamb classes.
11. There will be no more than 10 market lambs per class.
12. An exhibitor may show no more than 4 market lambs. Exhibitors must be with animals at time of weigh-in.
13. All entries must conform to official health regulations.
14. **All tie spaces and pens must be cleaned before leaving. Checks will be mailed.**
